

## Hebrews 10:19-25

- 1) We can have boldness to **enter** in because of what Jesus has done.
- 2) The veil is an example of Christ's body being torn so that we can have a **relationship** with God.
- 3) Jesus demonstrated what he expects of us; die to self to **serve** God.

## Hebrews 10:19-25

- 4) Now he is instructing us in what we should do about this.
  - a) We are to **walk** with the Lord.
  - b) We **acknowledge** our sins and lack of power to overcome sin and his righteous payment for sins and resurrection power over sin.
  - c) We are to consider **others** to provoke unto love and good works.
  - d) We are not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together so that we can have a consistent time to get together with believers to **serve** them.

## Hebrews 10:26-31

- 5) According to the context,
  - a) To willfully sin is to neglect your **relationship** with God.
  - b) To willfully sin is to not **die** to self to serve him.
  - c) To willfully sin is to **reject** Jesus as your authority.
  - d) To willfully sin is to draw away from God to **anything** else.
  - e) To willfully sin is to draw away from God to **anything** else.
  - f) To willfully sin is to not consider **others**.
  - g) To willfully sin is to not **fulfill** your place in the body.

## Hebrews 10:26-31

- 6) God will hold you **accountable** for what you know.
- 7) No more sacrifice for sins means that God will **judge** and **punish** willful disobedience.
